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Structure, Governance and Management Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 4 June 2018. It has a two-tier structure consisting of the Members and the Board of Trustees.

Appointment of trustees

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the constitution.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable purposes

- The provision of recreational facilities, or the organization of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended.
- The advancement of environmental protection or improvement

Activities

Aden Community Allotments Association is an allotment site with 96 allotments situated in Mintlaw in the Northeast of Scotland. Money is raised for the benefit of the allotments, the members and for the wider local community.

We celebrated the 10th Anniversary of our formation on 29th November 2023.

Growing



The continually wet and cold weather over the winter, and well into spring, meant that many of the plot-holders delayed planting their seeds and small plants. This had the consequence of shortening the growing season, and when the plants started to grow, they seemed to shoot up at an alarming rate. Summer did appear, eventually, and most of our members were able to harvest a reasonable amount of fruit and vegetables.

During last winter storms, some damage occurred to the community greenhouse. Some of the more hands-on members were able to rectify the damage and to replace the broken glass. Flooding also occurred at the far end of the site. This was mainly due to external drains and ditches being inundated by heavy rains. Unfortunately, there is not a lot that we are able to do until the floods soak away naturally.

Security

Following the break-in to the tool store shed and subsequent theft of tools and materials, we secured funding of £2875 from Aberdeenshire Council. This was to clad the shed in box-profile sheeting and to install a steel door. Additionally, we added funds to the grant, in order to install a CCTV system. Four CCTV cameras have been positioned so that the main buildings are protected, and the CCTV control system is in our most heavily protected building. Additionally, the system has a battery back-up power supply, as the power had been turned off during the break-in. This will provide, in the event of further break-ins, high quality images that may be passed to the police to assist them.

The combination lock on the main gate had been causing problems. Some members had been unable to operate the combination in certain weather conditions. We purchased an electronic lock, which proved to be very successful. Unfortunately, it broke and had to be replaced. This replacement electronic lock has since broken down. We are in consultation with the manufacturers regarding the robustness of the item.

Mini Plots

The mini plots, introduced last year, have proved to be very popular. So much so, that we have increased their number. The desired aim of the mini plots, to address the issue of untidy plots, has not been totally successful. However, there has been a reduction in the number of untidy plots. Again, locker style sheds have been provided for the mini plot-holders.

Functions



The first function, this reporting period, was a Tea in the Cabin held on 28th December. Considering it was held between Christmas and New Year, there was an excellent response from the local community. Although the community enjoyed the full functionality of the cabin, the profits of £800 were paid directly to Barnardo's by the Tea in the Cabin Team.

The second Tea in the cabin, similar to the first, was held at the end of March and attracted a large attendance. The profits from this event resulted in Aden Allotment donation to two very local charities, namely Cammy's Voice the Tardes, and to Men United Peterhead SCIO. Each received £500.

In spring we had a successful Meet 'N Greet, where we enjoyed a pot-luck lunch getting to meet our new plot holders.

The third Tea in the Cabin event at the end of June, again attracted a large crowd from the local community. A very impressive £1600 was split, by Aden Allotments, between two charities, Marie Curie and Alzheimers.

Our planned Open Day at the end of July was cancelled at the last minute due to unforeseen circumstances.

To signal the end of the main growing season, we held our Jumper BBQ. This was to celebrate our achievements and to hand out trophies to the members with the best plots.

Sharing our Learnings

This year, we have had several visits from external organisations. The allotments have a representative on the Aden Working Group where we contribute and work with other park partners to make Aden a better place for local people and communities. We attend training and networking events held by BDP, AVA and the Co-op ensuring we are linked with partner organisations.

In early spring, we had a visit by the Children from Pitfour School. Although the weather had been wet, and very few vegetables had been planted, the children thoroughly enjoyed their visit.

In early summer, the children from Mintlaw School visited the allotments. It was a much better day and, with most of the plots planted up, there was much more to see.

A group of members of New Pitsligo WRI also visited in early summer. They had a tour of the allotments and, afterwards, they enjoyed the hospitality of the cabin.

A course was held, in the cabin, by a local florist, for the creation of Christmas table centrepieces. A small charge was made, and the money raised was donated to charity.

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Several craft courses for fused glass art were held by a local artist. In all, 11 one-day courses were held during the early and late spring.

In June, a talk was delivered by one of our members, under the auspices of The Masonic Grand Lodge, about prostate cancer. The talk was very well attended, and a lot of relevant literature was distributed to members.

The local Masonic Lodge held a very successful BBQ on 22nd June, utilising the cabin and associated facilities.

The Friends of Aden held their AGM on 22nd July in the cabin and again, used the full range of facilities.

Achievements and Performance Donations Given

As part of our support programme for disadvantaged people the allotments donated financial gifts to a variety of local charities and to some national charities. The current financial situation has had a considerable impact on some members of the local community. The allotments have been aware of the challenges faced by low-income families and vulnerable adults across Central Buchan. We also donated £1000 In cash for food parcels and to assist with electric bills over the Christmas period.

Donations made to various charities.

Just before Christmas, a team of allotment members and community help made 150 Christmas wreaths and sold them for charity. The allotments provided the initial materials cost and the use of the cabin and facilities. Their efforts resulted in a creditable success, and although not directly from the allotments, the Wreath Making Team were able to donate £1630 to a variety of local charities.

The local garden centre has donated a selection of vegetable seeds, to be distributed to plot-holders.

Community plots and community shop

We have two community plots one focuses on pre-school children. The second is worked by people who have mental health issues and focuses on building confidence, self-esteem and improving skills. They have benefitted greatly and are now ready to move on to their own plots and projects. A new group will be sought to take over this plot.

A small shop was organised by a volunteer, bought in bulk, and sold peat free compost, grow bags, bone meal and fertilisers at cost to plot holders on site. A recycle yard where useful items like slabs, wood and fencing is also available on site.

Tools Project

We believe having shared resources is the most sustainable way to support plot holders who may struggle to afford tools and to reduce our environmental footprint. A rotovator as well as power tools, barrows and garden equipment are available to borrow. However, training must be completed before using any of the power tools.

The Future

We used to say that our volunteers were our greatest strength, and, although there is a small group of helpers out-with the committee who help to maintain the site, we don't seem to be able to attract enough help for some of the bigger routine tasks such as painting and joinery work. The result is that we have had to employ tradesmen to carry out these tasks, with the resulting drain on our finances.



It is with great sadness that our community champion, responsible for most of the charitable works, has decided to give up her plot and leave the allotments. She will be genuinely missed.

We envisage a smooth hand over to a new committee and will do our best to make the transition as straight forward as possible.
